NFALA Mourns the Lives Lost in Orlando, Florida and Stands in Solidarity with Its Brothers and Sisters in the LGBTQ Community

Chicago, IL, June 13, 2016 – The National Filipino American Lawyers Association (NFALA) joins the country and its brothers and sisters in the LGBTQ community in expressing outrage and sadness over the mass shooting at a gay nightclub in Orlando, Florida on June 12, 2016. NFALA expresses its deepest sympathies to the families, friends, and loved ones of the victims of this massacre.

NFALA stands in solidarity with the LGBTQ community and affirms its commitment to protecting the rights of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer/questioning people and to ensuring that the laws of the United States advance equality and justice for all of its communities.
